SILVER LAKE/HART

Surrounded by acres of wildlife and impressive sand dunes, the towns of Silver Lake and Hart are must-see Michigan favorites. Enjoy easy access to Lake Michigan from Silver Lake State Park, then go on to explore a hilly off-road dune park and miles of hiking trails. The area's uniquely beautiful landscape combined with the small-town charm of Hart make it the preferred beach vacation destination for many Michigan residents and visitors from across the nation.

MUSKEGON

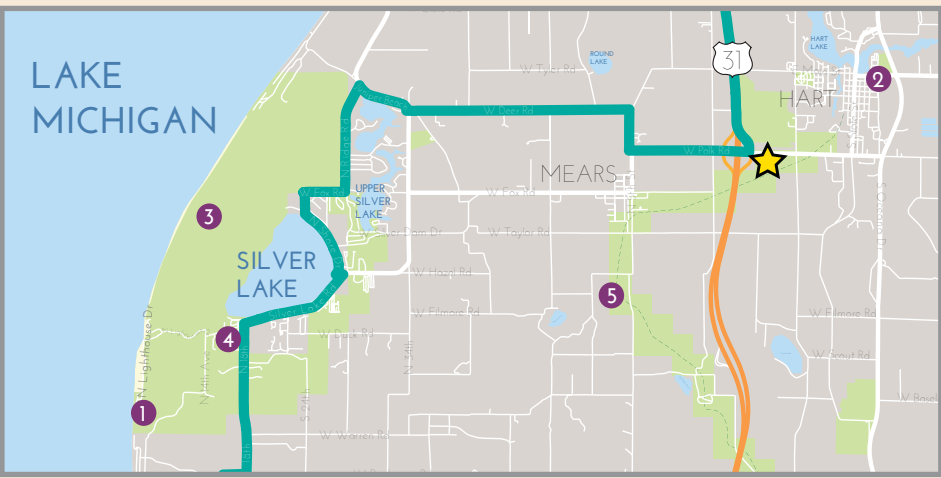

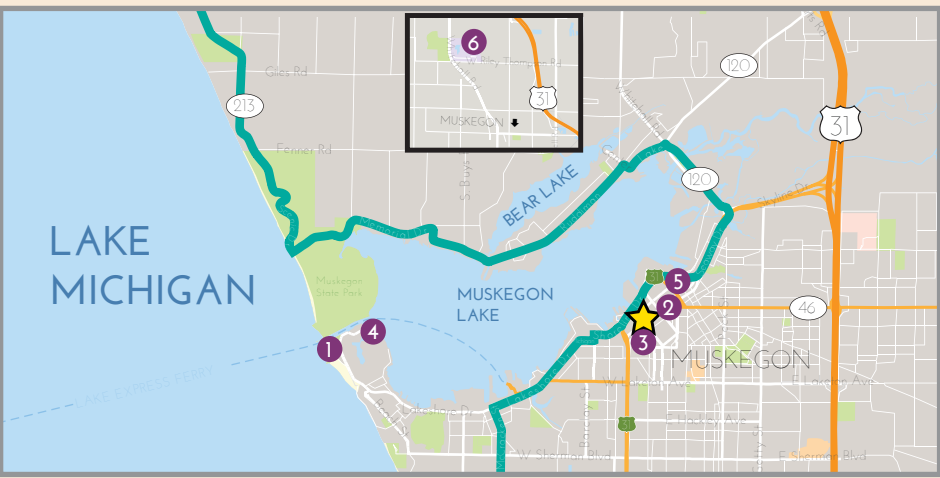


- 1 LITTLE SABLE POINT LIGHTHOUSE STATE PARK**
287 N Lighthouse Dr • Mears, MI 49436 • (231) 845-7417
Little Sable Point Lighthouse, the tallest brick lighthouse on Lake Michigan, was completed in 1874 and is considered a “must see” by most visitors. Open daily late May through mid September.

Visit Hart Historic District and discover numerous historical exhibits and buildings.
- 3 SILVER LAKE SAND DUNES STATE PARK**

The Silver Lake Sand Dunes are still moving and growing and considered one of the largest deposits of living dunes on the shores of Lake Michigan. Open April 1 through October 31.
- 4 MAC WOODS DUNE RIDES (SEASONAL)**

Enjoy a safe, fun-filled dune ride over Silver Lake Sand Dunes. Your 40-minute ride will include climbing up the summit, breathtaking views of the dune area, and driving past sparkling Silver Lake.

Enjoy this paved 22-mile long trail perfect for bikers, walkers, and runners. A former railroad now transformed into a scenic wonderland perfect for those who love the outdoors.

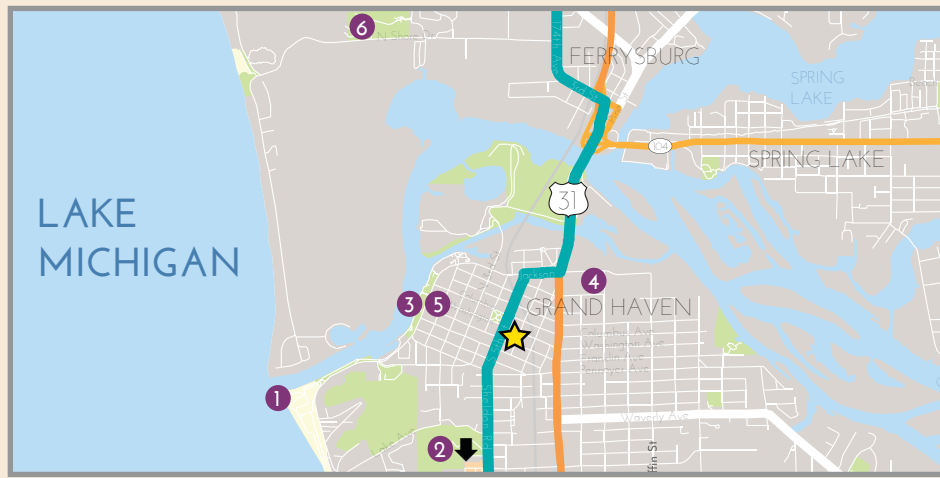


- 1 PERE MARQUETTE PARK**

2.5 miles of public, sugar sand beach on Lake Michigan. This park includes two light towers, a walkable pier, a channel walkway connecting Lake Michigan to Muskegon Lake, public art, a permanent restroom, dining, play, and picnic areas.
- 2 MUSKEGON MUSEUM OF ART**

Changing national and international exhibitions enhance displays from the museum’s well-known and renowned permanent collection.
- 3 HACKLEY & HUME HISTORIC SITE**

Tour two fully restored Queen Ann-style Lumber Baron mansions and the “City Barn” between them.
- 4 USS SILVERSIDES SUBMARINE MUSEUM**

Located on the Muskegon Channel, tour a naval history museum, Coast Guard Cutter, and WWII submarine, one of the most decorated subs in our nation’s history.
- 5 DOWNTOWN MUSKEGON**

Walkable lakeshore downtown with convention center, museums, historical tours, outdoor art, farmers market, shopping, dining, distilleries, breweries, and a social district.

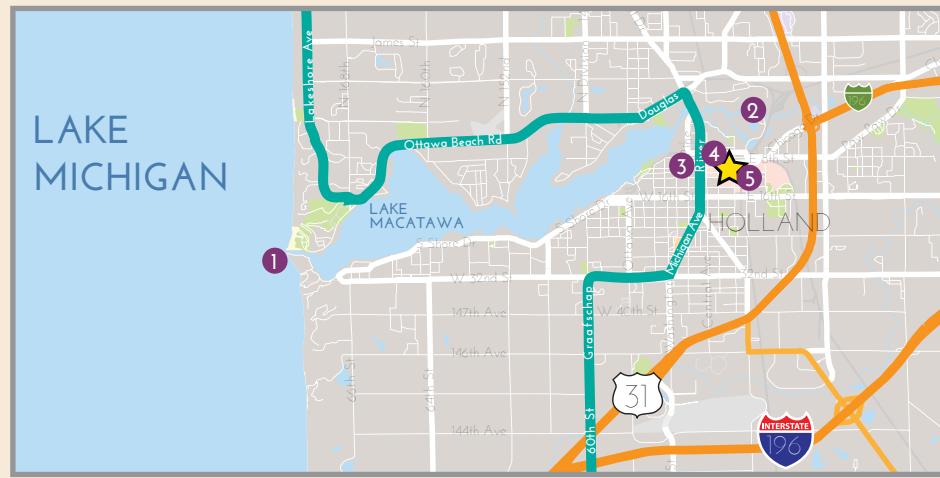


- 1 GRAND HAVEN LIGHTHOUSE**

The Grand Haven Lighthouses and Piers are historical must-see attractions and are one of the most photographed lighthouses in the Midwest.
- 2 OLIVE SHORES PARK**
855 Olive Shores Ave, West Olive • (616) 786-4847
This mostly-wooded 10-acre site includes mature forest, a steep dune formation, and 738-feet of Lake Michigan frontage. An extensive series of stairs & boardwalks traverse the dunes and provide access to the sandy beach.
- 3 MUSICAL FOUNTAIN (SEASONAL)**

This 20-minute synchronized water and light show is accompanied with music of all varieties. Shows start nightly at dusk, Memorial Day through Labor Day.
- 4 LAKESHORE TROLLEY (SEASONAL)**

The trolleys offer a delightful way to get around town. Choose from one of two routes exploring sights and attractions for the Grand Haven area. Seven days a week, Memorial Day through Labor Day.

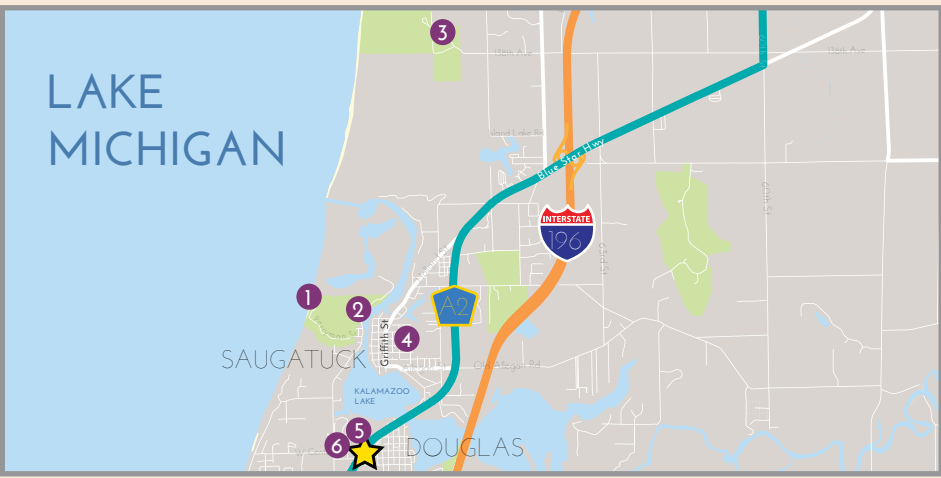


- 1 BIG RED LIGHTHOUSE**

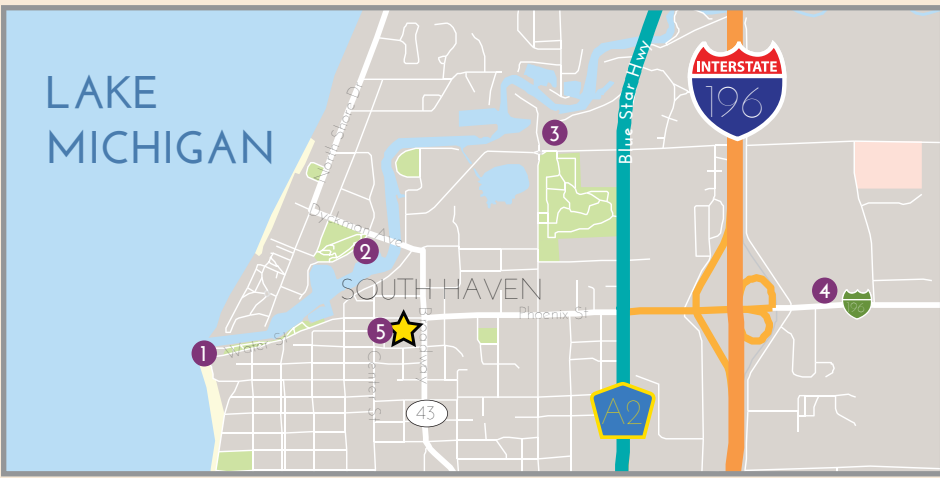


- 1 OVAL BEACH**

Oval Beach has acquired impressive awards over the years, including *Conde Nast Traveler’s* Top 25 Beaches! Parking, concessions, barbecuing, and picnic area on site.
- 2 MT. BALDHEAD**
769 Park St • (269) 857-2603
Climb 303 steps to the top of Mt. Baldhead and descend onto coastal sands and hike the one-mile loop back. Also home to Mt. Baldhead Radar Tower, a Cold War relic dating back to 1958, built to detect Russian planes flying over the Great Lakes.
- 3 SAUGATUCK DUNES STATE PARK**

This park encompasses 1,000 acres of rolling hills and freshwater coastal dunes including two and a half miles of Lake Michigan shoreline.
- 4 DINING/CULINARY***
This small coastal getaway boasts fantastic restaurants for foodies. With bushels of produce ripe for the picking within a 10-mile radius, farm-to-table fare becomes elevated by the bounty of what’s locally harvested.
- 5 CRAFT BEVERAGE TRAIL***
Don’t miss stopping at the many spots along our Craft Beverage Trail! We have breweries, vineyards, tasting rooms, distilleries, and cider mills. (21+)
- 6 LOCAL ART***
Home to numerous galleries, studios, exhibitions, and public art installations, art aficionados will find much to appreciate in the Saugatuck/Douglas/Fennville area.

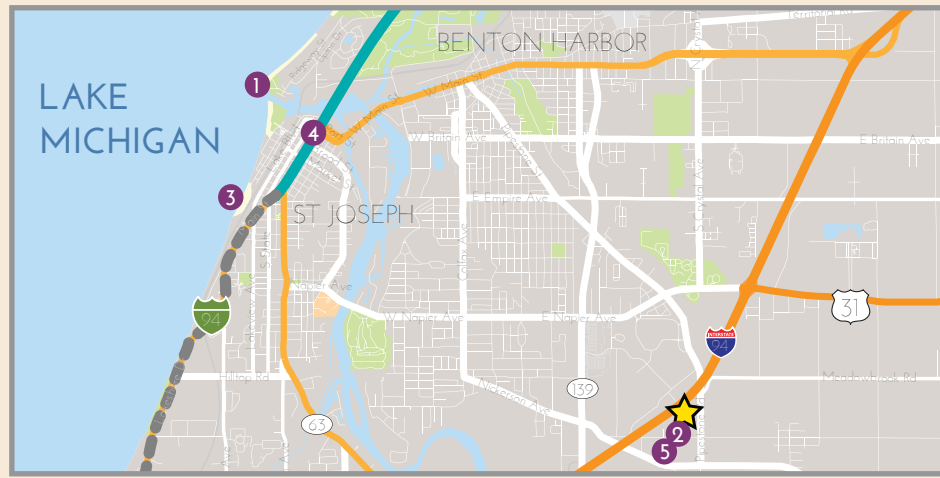


- 1 SOUTH HAVEN LIGHTHOUSE**

The South Haven Lighthouse has stood at the mouth of the Black River since 1871. Its steel catwalk is one of four remaining in Michigan, and the light is still in operation. The lighthouse is located at our popular South Beach and is walkable from downtown.
- 2 MICHIGAN MARITIME MUSEUM**

This 33.5-mile Pure Michigan Trail runs from South Haven to Kalamazoo and is the starting point for the Great Lake-to-Lake Route #1.
